

### **5** Water Irrigation Schemes

We are pleased to announce the successful completion of five irrigation schemes in the Mangochi area, which are now yielding fruitful results. These projects have positively impacted the lives of 1500 beneficiaries in the community.

### 9 Boreholes

Constructed in rural villages giving access to clean drinking water to the entire village, benefitting 18,000 people.

### Somba and Makanjira Health & Maternity Clinics

The clinics serve nearly 10,000 people per month treating conditions such as HIV, Malaria and water-borne diseases. The maternity facilitates approximately 1080 live births across both sites, seeing over 6000 expecting mothers annually.

### The Impact and Benefits:

The clinics support people across 30 villages (out of which 12% are treated for HIV and 52% are treated for Malaria)

### The Impact and Benefits:

### **2** Building Education Centres

Primary School blocks were built in Masuku and Mikundi hubs to further enhance the education facilities

### 2 Masjid and Madressah Complex

A Masjid was constructed in a rural area to cater for the religious and spiritual needs of the local muslim communities needs. The madressah caters in educating children and adults about the fundamentals of Islam.

### **Nursery Sponsorship**

In Malawi, children not attending nursery start primary school at a disadvantage. Partnering with An Nasihah Nursery, we launched our first nursery to address this issue, aiming to expand the model nationwide.

### 33 Students Sponsored

We're sponsoring students through accredited university courses, aiming to empower them as future professionals who contribute positively to their communities.







### SUSTAINABLE LIVING

Drop of Compassion aims to empower communities in Malawi, enabling them to achieve self-sustainability, secure futures for their families, and contribute to their communities. These projects complement our irrigation initiative and have demonstrated significant positive impact.

### The Impact and Benefits to date:

### 500 People benefit from Honey

Since inception we are benefitting 14 villages, that's 360 families. This project encourages empowering women, the elderly and orphans.

### 1000 Goats provided

950 females and 50 males across 20 villages. Benefitting approx 6650 people to date.

### 13,000+ Trees Planted

3000 Seedlings were planted in irrigation sites. Trees were also planted around schools to educate children about the natural environment and empower them as they watch these trees grow.

Distributing bicycles in Malawi boosts community access to essential services and markets, saving time and enhancing productivity and family time.

One place that's really special to us is Somba in Mangochi. Just a few years ago it was barren land. But thanks to your generosity, things are changing fast. Our "Community Development Hub" is transforming the area, creating a thriving economy and infrastructure.

Think about it: clean water, safe homes, schools, hospitals - these are things many of us take for granted. But in Somba, your donations are making all the difference. Now, people have access to clean water, food security, healthcare, education, and ways to support themselves.

#### Here's what's happening in Somba today:

- Babies are being born in our maternity wing.
- Locals can get free clinical support at our health center.
- Everyone, including animals, can access clean water through our projects.
- Families are growing crops year-round thanks to our irrigation projects.
- People are earning sustainable livings through projects like fish farming and fruit tree planting.
- Kids are getting a great education, from nursery all the way to university.
- Victims of the 2015 floods received emergency aid and stronger, safer homes.

This cycle - from birth to adulthood - empowers people to become leaders in their community, giving back and making a real difference.

And it doesn't stop there. We're developing several more hubs in **Mikundi, Masuku, Katema, Kathuli, Chigwaja, Kwiputi and Jali Perusi,** with plans to expand even further. Together, we're creating lasting change, one community at a time.
